ACTIVITY

FURTHER SUGGESTIONS

Take a paper plate and use it to make a lion mask. Add whiskers, ears, eyes (cut small holes in plate for child to see through), nose and curled paper strips for the mane.

Turn a shoebox upside down and cut cage-like bars from one side. Make small cardboard lions (see back page for pattern), and place inside. Use pipe cleaner/ peg/ playdough/ plastic people, to act out the story.
